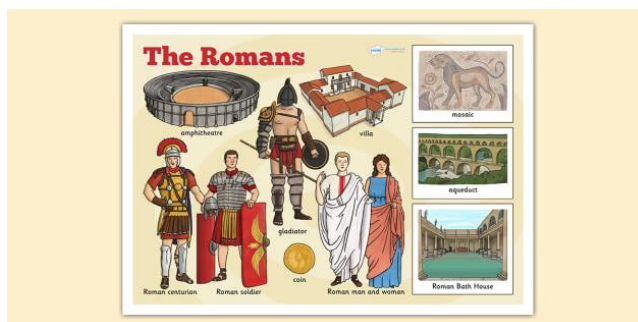

Welcome to the final term of the year. It is always a busy time! We are learning about the Romans this term. This will be part of our learning in history and we will share our knowledge in literacy.

Homework.

Homework will be given out on a Wednesday and needs to be returned by the following Monday. Each week the children will be given spellings, Literacy and Numeracy. Each piece should take no more than 20 minutes to complete. In addition to this, the children need to practise learning their multiplication facts and continue to read their home reading book at least three times a week. Please ensure reading record books are signed by an adult each week.

Reading

Your child will have a reading book that they will bring home on a Monday along with their Reading Record.

This book should be read at home throughout the week. Your child can read their book on their own, but we would also like them to read at least three times with an adult. This should be logged in the Reading Record by the adult.

The Reading Record needs to be returned to school each Monday along with the reading book if it is completed. Your child can keep their book for more than a week if they need to. If your child has chosen a shorter book and completes it, they should read it more than once before returning it the following week.
