Once your child is confidently recognising the first 16 phonemes, they will also bring home a book linked to their development of skills with the RWI phonics program. Please listen to your child read the RWI book daily and keep that in the book bag so that, as your child progresses, the book can be changed as needed. (Please send book bags into school daily).

Communication, Language and Literacy

We will:

- Learn Phonics to develop reading and writing.
- Learn how to segment and blend to read and spell words.
- Listen to stories and predict what we think will happen.
- Learn to talk one-at-a-time and listen when someone else is talking.



Physical Development

We will:

- Develop fine motor skills through play dough, threading, pegging, construction toys, painting and pencil activities.
- Develop gross motor skills through climbing apparatus, ride on toys, den making and playground toys.
- Develop dance skills and spatial awareness moving to music in a variety of ways.
- Respond to spoken instructions.
- Begin to develop balance, movement and tranquillity through yoga and gymnastics.
