### Covid-19

We are following the NHS guidance:

Your child should try to stay home and avoid contact with other people if they have symptoms of COVID-19 and they either:

- have a high temperature
- do not feel well enough to go to school, college or childcare, or do their normal activities

They can go back to school, college or childcare when they feel better or do not have a high temperature.

There is no legal obligation to isolate, and we are advising families to keep children off school if they are unwell, as we would with any other illness. Children can return to school when they feel better.

#### **Breakfast Club**

Breakfast Club opens at 8.00am each day; sessions must be booked in advance via Parentmail to guarantee their child's place. The booking system is available to book sessions 8 weeks in advance. The cost of each session is £2.00 (children entitled to Free School Meals will not need to pay) and **ALL** sessions must be booked in advance, regardless whether they are chargeable or not.

#### **ParentMail**

We'd like to encourage ALL parents to download the APP as there are a number of benefits both to you and for the school.

- You don't need to login to pickup messages or attachments when you use the APP.
- The APP stores all the messages we send you in one place so you don't have to search.
- Every message sent arrives as an instant alert on your mobile.\* (important see below)
- \* We currently send text messages from time to time, especially for urgent situations, but these are expensive and cost the school hundreds of pounds each year. If we can persuade parents to use the APP we can stop sending text messages completely and put the money spent to better use.

You can download the APP for free from either the Apple APP store or the Google Play Store and it will

## REMINDERS

 Parking - in order to keep the access to school clear for emergency services (at all times) and for the safeguarding and well-being of children being brought into school and collected by taxi, please DO NOT park in the yellow boxed area.



- For safety reasons, please be reminded that access through the staff car park is prohibited – please use the pathways to enter the school grounds.
- Cycling and scooters children are reminded that bicycles and scooters must be dismounted when in the school grounds.

Healthy Snacks



Please be reminded that children may only bring in:

- Fresh or dried fruit e.g. apple, banana, raisins (not fruit winder etc)
- Vegetables e.g. carrot sticks
- Plain biscuits e.g. rich tea, digestive (not chocolate, cream or jam)
- Crackers or plain rice cakes (not cereal bars or crisps)
- Water bottles only (not juice or squash)
- If you have any letters or paperwork for the office, for your convenience there is a post box located outside the main school entrance.
- **Trim Trail** children are not permitted to play on the trim-trail equipment out of normal supervised sessions, including pre-school children; this is a requirement of the Risk Assessment.
- Medical, Dental and Hospital Appointments and Absences please phone or email the school to advise; messages can be left on our answerphone or email <a href="mailto:enquiries@williamstukeley.lincs.sch.uk">enquiries@williamstukeley.lincs.sch.uk</a>
   Please note, absences need to be followed up in writing.

Where possible, we encourage appointments to take place out of school time, in order not to disrupt the child's education; every effort should be made to arrange medical appointments outside school hours. Whilst we appreciate that medical appointments are unavoidable and the times not always flexible, such absences usually only take up part of a day so children, for example, could be brought into school for morning registration and return to school following the appointment. School should be informed of such absences in writing in advance, and we also require proof i.e. copy of appointment letter / text message reminder.

- If you need to leave an absence message on the school answerphone, please can we remind parents/carers to leave a specific reason for absence i.e. give details if ill. To ensure the safety of all the children in school we do need to know more than 'feeling unwell' or 'not very well'.
- Please be reminded that our policy is 48 hours absence from school following any episode of vomiting or diarrhoea.
